

## Safcor Panalpina's bulletin to our valued partners

### Durban Harbour Update

Threatened secondary strike action has been averted following negotiations between the disputing parties. The port is reported to be working normally, but is very congested.

Extensive delays are currently being experienced in collections and deliveries from the Container Terminal: 10 ships are in the anchorage awaiting berths and a further 30 are expected in the next 8 days. The terminal is presently 66% full.

Unfamiliarity by drivers with the new NAVIS cargo management system recently introduced at the port is believed to be one of the causes for the current slow working, along with other teething problems.

Safcor Panalpina will continue to monitor the situation and attempt to expedite clients' cargo.
