Road Transport Strike Update

The Road Freight Employers' Association is currently waiting on Unions' responses to a settlement offer that was tabled by the RFEA late yesterday. Incidents of intimidation and violence continue to be reported from various places around the country with the "hotspots" reported to be the East Rand (especially Kempton Park, Isando and the airport area), the Durban and East London industrial areas, as well as CBD districts generally.

While every effort is being made to mitigate the impact of the ongoing strike action, Safcor Panalpina regrets that we cannot guarantee timed deliveries during this period, or be held responsible for any potential storage demurrage overstay or additional costs resulting therefrom.
