All road transport operations in South Africa are experiencing some impact by driver strike action, which is set to begin on Friday 11th February. Members of SATAWU are expected to join the strike on Sunday 13th February.

Many transport operators are understood to have made contingency plans to continue operations during this time. All have stressed that they will do so as long as the safety of personnel, equipment and cargoes is not under threat.
