### Transnet strike update #8

South Africa's ports and container terminals continue to be strikebound, with only very limited activity taking place at some ports.

At present there are 13 vessels awaiting berths in the Durban anchorage and 10 in port. A further 29 are expected in the next week. A number of ships have omitted planned South African calls and have retained cargo on board for return on future voyages. Safcor Panalpina will attempt to notify owners of affected cargoes where possible.

Transnet has confirmed that talks broke down again on Sunday night (16th May).
